#### DECIDE ON A COURSE

- IF YOU ARE APPLYING FOR A "CAREER" DEGREE (E.G. MEDICINE, VETERINARY, LAW, TEACHING) ORGANISE SOME RELEVANT WORK EXPERIENCE BEFORE SEPTEMBER.
- GET INVOLVED IN EXTRA CURRICULAR ACTIVITIES IN / OR OUT OF SCHOOL. THEY MAY BE
  DIRECTLY RELEVANT TO YOUR COURSE, OR AT LEAST ALLOW YOU TO DEMONSTRATE
  LEADERSHIP QUALITIES, GOOD COMMUNICATION SKILLS, RESPONSIBILITY AND RELIABILITY
  ETC.
  - THESE COULD INVOLVE: NCS, FUTURE FRONTIERS, DUKE OF EDINBURGH, ETC.
- THINK ABOUT SUPER CURRICULAR ACTIVITIES THOSE THAT TAKE YOUR REGULAR CURRICULUM FURTHER. THEY TAKE THE SUBJECTS YOU STUDY IN THE CLASSROOM BEYOND THAT WHICH YOUR TEACHER HAS TAUGHT YOU.



Additional directed reading is crucial to informed choices and application success. Applicants should keep a reading journal.


Reading must be critical and analytical:

- What is the argument in the book/article?
- What is the supporting evidence? Flaws?
- What does the applicant think?





#### Super-curricular ideas: Project work



Working towards a piece of work such as the Extended Project Qualification (EPQ) helps students to focus their super-curricular learning in an area they are particularly interested in.

 The EPQ wouldn't form part of an offer for an applicant, but completing one is encouraged. Super-curricular ideas: University taster sessions







#### Course summary

Biochemistry attempts to understand the complex array of molecules and their interactions which come together to create all living things. Biochemistry lies at the interface between biology and medicine. Whether it be single-celled bacteria or the trillions of cells found in humans, all of the fundamental processes of the cell happen at the biochemical level. Understanding these processes can provide insights into subjects ranging from the evolution of life to developing treatments for common conditions such as diabetes, cancer and obesity.

# APPLYING TO OXFORD AND CAMBRIDGE

This is only worth considering if you achieved mostly A\*s / Grade 9s at GCSE, are going to achieve grade A (or A\*) in all your subjects in Year 13. In addition, you need to be very clear about why you want to study the course you are applying to, as you will have to talk about this during your interview.

- YOUR APPLICATION HAS TO BE SUBMITTED FAR EARLIER. YOU SHOULD AIM TO COMPLETE THE MAJORITY OF THE APPLICATION FORM *BEFORE* THE END OF THE SUMMER TERM.
- OXFORD MAY ASK YOU TO TAKE A PRE-INTERVIEW TEST, OR SUBMIT A PORTFOLIO OF WORK.
- CAMBRIDGE MAY ASK YOU TO A PRE-INTERVIEW TEST, OR AN AT INTERVIEW TEST, OR SUBMIT A PORTFOLIO OF WORK. THEY MAY ALSO ASK YOU TO TAKE A STEP IN THE SUMMER EXAMINATION PERIOD OF YEAR 13.
- THEY DON'T GIVE OUT ANY OFFERS BEFORE YOU HAVE GONE THROUGH A RIGOROUS INTERVIEW PROCESS.



# APPLYING FOR (ART & DESIGN) FOUNDATION COURSES

- IF YOU WISH TO STUDY ART AND DESIGN AT DEGREE LEVEL, YOU
  NORMALLY NEED TO COMPLETE A FOUNDATION YEAR FIRST.
- THESE COURSES HAVE A DIFFERENT APPLICATION PROCEDURE TO DEGREES AND YOU HAVE TO MAKE AN INDIVIDUAL APPLICATION TO EACH INSTITUTION YOU WISH TO APPLY TO.
- YOU NEED TO CONTACT THE INDIVIDUAL INSTITUTIONS YOURSELF TO GET AN APPLICATION FORM, BUT WE WILL THEN SUPPORT YOU IN COMPLETING IT.
- STUDENTS NORMALLY APPLY LOCALLY FOR A FOUNDATION COURSE
- You make your UCAS application during your Foundation Year if you wish to go on to study a degree.





#### ADVICE FOR MEDICS

- COMPETITION IS INTENSE (IN 2018, IMPERIAL HAD 2,299 APPLICANTS, INTERVIEWED 867, OFFERED 611, ENROLLED 304)
- YOU MAY END UP RECEIVING JUST ONE OFFER; IN THIS CYCLE, ONLY ONE OF OUR LEARNERS WHO APPLIED HAS AN OFFER. DON'T SET YOUR HEART ON A PARTICULAR MEDICAL SCHOOL
- Medical schools reject excellent applicants
- CONSIDER IT AS POTENTIALLY THE FIRST TIME OF TWO ATTEMPTS, IF YOU ARE COMPETITIVE AND RESILIENT ENOUGH TO REAPPLY
- A YEAR 14 APPLICATION IS A WELL-TRODDEN, SUCCESSFUL PATH A GAP YEAR CAN BE A GOOD THING FOR ASPIRING MEDICS
- That said, a third year to get the A Level grades is <u>often</u> unacceptable without extenuating circumstances

- KEEP WORKING HARD ON YOUR YEAR 12 COURSES
- ORGANISE WORK EXPERIENCE WHERE NECESSARY (PARTICULARLY FOR MEDICS, Vets and Architects)
- READ/RESEARCH AROUND YOUR SUBJECT MORE DEEPLY,
  PARTICULARLY IF YOU ARE PLANNING TO APPLY TO OXBRIDGE

  UNTIL YOU HAVE PAID.



# WHAT HAPPENS AFTER YOUR FORM HAS BEEN SENT TO UCAS?

- YOU RECEIVE A CONFIRMATION EMAIL FROM UCAS WITHIN A FEW DAYS OF YOUR FORM BEING SENT.
- UCAS SEND THE FORM TO THE 5 UNIVERSITIES YOU HAVE APPLIED TO, REMOVING THE DETAILS OF THE OTHER 4 FROM EACH VERSION.
- YOU MAY START TO HEAR FROM UNIVERSITIES VERY QUICKLY, OR YOU MAY WAIT FOR QUITE A WHILE EACH UNIVERSITY HAS THEIR OWN SLIGHTLY UNIQUE WAY OF DEALING WITH APPLICATIONS!
- YOU WILL HOPEFULLY RECEIVE EITHER CONDITIONAL OFFERS OR AN INTERVIEW (WHICH, IF SUCCESSFUL WILL LEAD TO A CONDITIONAL OFFER).
- ONCE YOU HAVE BEEN EITHER ACCEPTED OR REJECTED BY ALL 5 OF YOUR CHOICES, YOU WILL THEN BE EMAILED A DECISION FORM BY UCAS. YOU THEN HAVE TO MAKE A FIRM ACCEPTANCE OF ONE PLACE AND ALSO SELECT AN INSURANCE PLACE AS WELL, OR YOU CAN REJECT ALL THE OFFERS. THE DEADLINE FOR THIS IS USUALLY IN MAY.



# WHAT HAPPENS IF YOU ARE REJECTED BY ALL 5 UNIVERSITIES?

- IF YOU DO NOT RECEIVE OFFERS FROM ANY OF YOUR 5 CHOICES THEN YOU ARE ELIGIBLE FOR UCAS EXTRA, WHICH ALLOWS YOU TO APPLY FOR ANOTHER COURSE. EXTRA ALLOWS YOU TO APPLY FOR COURSES WITH VACANCIES BETWEEN THE END OF FEBRUARY AND THE END OF JUNE.
- In Extra, you apply for one course at a time and wait for their decision before you can apply anywhere else.
- You can also use Extra even if you have received offers from some of your original 5 choices, although you need to reject all of these offers before you can use Extra.



# WHAT HAPPENS ON A-LEVEL RESULTS DAY 2022

- IF YOU HAVE ACHIEVED THE GRADES FOR YOUR FIRST CHOICE UNIVERSITY THEN YOU WILL AUTOMATICALLY HAVE A PLACE THERE.
- IF NOT, BUT YOU HAVE AT LEAST ACHIEVED THE GRADES FOR YOUR INSURANCE CHOICE YOU WILL HAVE A PLACE THERE.
- Universities may take you even if you have only just missed the grades in their offer but you should not count on this happening and over the last couple of years demand for places on many courses has been greater than the number of places that are available.
- You can check the UCAS website early in the morning before coming into school to get your results, as often the universities have already made a decision.
- IF YOU HAVE BEEN UNSUCCESSFUL IN OBTAINING THE GRADES REQUIRED BY YOUR INSURANCE CHOICE, OR IF YOU HAD NO OFFERS, YOU CAN THEN ACCESS CLEARING AND HOPEFULLY WILL STILL BE SUCCESSFUL IN GAINING A PLACE.

Studying a year or all of a degree abroad can have great benefits. Here are some options if you are considering studying abroad.

In 2014/15, around 24,000 UK students spent time studying or working abroad. Over 96% of these were undergraduate students, and the rest were postgraduates.



#### **NEED-BLIND ADMISSIONS**

Some US universities are need-blind and do not base admissions decisions on your financial circumstances. They will meet your full financial need if you are admitted. This does not mean it is free; you are still expected to make <u>some</u> financial contribution, usually calculated based on an assessment of your parents' income.

VERY FEW UNIVERSITIES IN THE USA ARE NEED-BLIND <u>AND</u> OFFER FULL FINANCIAL NEED TO <u>INTERNATIONAL</u> STUDENTS. <u>THEY ARE THE MOST</u> COMPETITIVE FOR ADMISSION. CURRENTLY, THE FOLLOWING US UNIVERSITIES OFFER THIS:



- STUDENT FINANCE LOAN CAN COVER FEES (UP TO £9250 PER YEAR; UNIVERSITIES MUST HELP OUT POORER STUDENTS IF THEY CHARGE THE MAXIMUM) AND ALSO LIVING EXPENSES
- You pay back nothing when you study but interest on your debt will accrue at 5.6% (RPI + 2%)
- YOU PAY BACK WHEN EARNING MORE THAN £26,575 AT 9% OF YOUR INCOME OVER THAT AMOUNT, VIA THE TAX SYSTEM: £308 FOR £30K SALARY, SPREAD OVER THE YEAR
- RPI INTEREST RATE FOR LOW EARNERS; HIGHER INTEREST RATE FOR HIGHER EARNERS (RPI + UP TO 3%)
- YOU STOP PAYING IF YOUR SALARY DROPS BELOW £26,575
- YOU PAY FOR A MAXIMUM OF 30 YEARS, THEN IT'S WRITTEN OFF

#### STUDENT FINANCE (AT THE MOMENT)

- This information from Martin Lewis (updated September 2020) is a useful way of getting your head around the worry of '£50K debt'
- FOR HIM, THE KEY IS TO FOCUS ON WHAT YOU REPAY, NOT WHAT YOU OWE:
- Low earners will pay back little of their debt
- Medium earners will only pay back some of it.

#### PERSONAL STATEMENTS

- YOU CAN ENTER UP TO 4,000 CHARACTERS INCLUDING SPACES OR 47 LINES OF TEXT (INCLUDING BLANK LINES), WHICHEVER COMES FIRST.
- When you save text, the system will tell you how many characters are left or if you have used too many.
- You can preview your statement after you have saved it.
- You cannot use italics, bold or underlining.
- THE SYSTEM WILL RECOGNISE EUROPEAN CHARACTERS EG Â É È
- WRITE YOUR PERSONAL STATEMENT IN WORD AND PASTE ONTO THE UCAS FORM AND USE A CLEAR FONT E.G. VERDANA, ARIAL, TIMES NEW ROMAN SIZE 12.

#### STRUCTURE

- 50 75% SHOULD BE ABOUT WHY YOU WANT TO APPLY FOR THE PARTICULAR COURSE, HOW YOUR VARIOUS EXPERIENCES SUPPORT THIS CHOICE.
- THE OTHER 25 50% SHOULD BE ABOUT SUPPORTING EVIDENCE RELATING TO TRANSFERABLE SKILLS
   VOLUNTEERING, HOBBIES, ETC.
- USE POSITIVE AND APPROPRIATE LANGUAGE
  - Don't be negative, turn anything negative into a positive and use this to your advantage and how you overcame that obstacle.

#### WRITING ABOUT THE COURSE

- AT LEAST TWO THIRDS OF YOUR PERSONAL STATEMENT SHOULD RELATE TO THE COURSE
- THE PERSONAL STATEMENT WILL BE SEEN BY ALL YOUR CHOICES AND COULD BE USED
  AS THE BASIS FOR AN INTERVIEW, SO BE PREPARED TO ANSWER QUESTIONS ON IT
- REMEMBER, IN MOST CASES, THIS WILL BE THE ONLY WRITTEN WORK THAT THE COURSE TUTOR SEES BEFORE MAKING A DECISION

- Which skills and experience do you have that will help you succeed on the course.
- What have your done to develop your knowledge of the subject?
- What evidence is there that you have read, studied, gained experiences outside the confines of your A level courses?
- \*include evidence of research, additional reading, show enthusiasm, don't just list things.

#### TRANSFERABLE SKILLS

 RESILIENCE, INDEPENDENT STUDY AND RESEARCH SKILLS, TEAM WORKING SKILLS, TIME MANAGEMENT, COMMUNICATION, CONFIDENCE, DETERMINATION, FLEXIBILITY, ADAPTABILITY, RELIABILITY.

- Examples such as...
- WAITER DIPLOMACY, FLEXIBILITY, ASSERTIVENESS
- VOLUNTARY FUNDRAISING DRIVE / PERSISTENCE, FINANCIAL AWARENESS

#### PERSONAL STATEMENT — TOP TIPS

- Do expect to produce several drafts
- Do ask people you trust for their feedback
- Do check website course content and entry profiles
- Do cut the small talk be concise
- **Do** CHECK OBSESSIVELY (DO NOT RELY ON SPELL CHECK)

- Don't use elaborate language
- Don't list your achievements. (show not tell and give examples to illustrate)
- Don't lie or exaggerate
- Don't force humour
- Don't plagiarise (universities scan STATEMENTS TO DETECT COMMON PHRASES, SENTENCES ETC. THE COPYCATCH SYSTEM CHECKS EACH STATEMENT TO FIND SIMILARITIES)
- Don't leave it to the last minute



#### TAKING A GAP YEAR

Some students choose to defer their entry by a year. You should still apply during the 2021/2022 academic year, even if you don't plan to start until September 2023.

#### SENSIBLE REASONS TO TAKE A GAP YEAR;

- YOU ARE PLANNING TO SPEND TIME DOING CHARITY / CONSERVATION WORK, EITHER IN THE UK OR ABROAD. (THERE ARE MANY COMPANIES OFFERING THESE OPPORTUNITIES — SOME DETAILS ARE AVAILABLE IN THE STUDY ROOM
- YOU NEED TO EARN SOME MONEY TO HELP FINANCE YOUR TIME AT UNIVERSITY

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


